At United Disabled Persons of Kenya (UDPK) we are taking the COVID-19 pandemic very seriously, and we are keen to ensure we continue with our work wherever possible.

We are keenly monitoring the developments on the virus situation in the country on daily basis and following official advice from Kenya government and other trusted sources.

On Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> the Ministry of Health (MOH) Kenya, Confirmed 15 cases of coronavirus infection. In the light of these developments and in order to take necessary preventive precautions, we have decided to alter our working schedule and practices.

Our staff will be working remotely i.e. from home (away from the physical office) starting Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2020. During this period we will continue to be available to you through: Phone, Email, Online on our website and via our other social media platforms.

The health and safety of our project/programs participants, staff, partners and supporters is always our top priority. In that regard, we have temporarily stopped any activities which involve bringing people together physically. This is in line with the directives given by Kenyan Government and other health experts.

In order to do our part to combat the COVID-19 crisis and flatten the Curve, we had to temporarily change the way we execute our mandate, but our staff is as committed as always.

We will continue working remotely to support project partners, participants and other persons involved with our projects/programs including communities.

As soon as Government issues directives on return to normal situation, our work and activities will resume promptly

We understand that the COVID-19 crisis will mostly have great impact on people with disabilities, so we remain very committed to the work we do and continue tirelessly to offer our support.
